### HAPPY INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATING ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Today, in industrialized countries, women are a significant part of the workforce. They also have many rights that are the result of strong predecessors that relentlessly fought and paved the way for future generations. The 8th of March is globally celebrated as International Women's Day as a focus in the Women's Rights Movement to emphasize the prevalent issues in gender equality, violence and abuse against women and the lack of opportunities that still exist. But beyond that, it is also a day to recognize the achievements of the significant women in our lives.





Women in Science KIARA NIRGHIN Kiara is a young South African scientist who won the grand prize at the Google Science Fair at the age of 16. After going through one of the worst droughts in 45 years in her home country, in 2015, Kiara started researching a solution that would be inexpensive and sustainable for the environment. With those goals in mind, she invented a polymer made from waste that could retain 84% of its weight in water during droughts. This green and economical solution ensures a higher degree of food security in affected areas. Today she is a speaker for causes related to the environment and women's access to education.



Women's Education MALALA YOUSAFZAI

Since 2012, Malala has become an international symbol for the fight for women's equal access to education. In her native country of Pakistan, she was targeted by the Taliban because of speaking out for Women's education. At the age of 15, she fearlessly stood up when the man holding a firearm came out looking for her and called out her name. That's when she got shot. Even after going through this traumatizing event, today, she is more active than ever in the fight for women's equal rights.



#### Women in Entrepreneurship

#### KIRAN MAZUMDAR-SHAW

In 1974, Kiran got curious about her dad's work and he encouraged her to become a brewmaster although it was a career path that was very unconventional for a woman. After getting her degree, she quickly realized that a woman had little chance to advance in terms of career in India. She looked into opportunities abroad and it opened the doors for her to realize her ambitions. She later launched her biopharmaceutical company from a shed she rented. Because she never gave up through hardships, she is today the second wealthiest self-made woman in India.

### Women in Politics



#### **ING-WEN TSAI**

In 2016, Ing-Wen became the first female leader of Taiwan, traditionally a patriarchal country. Ing-Wen is supportive of the underprivileged groups in society such as the poor, women, children, LGBT groups and Indigenous people and has taken action to reduce unemployment, expand childcare support and much more in order to give back to society. Ing-Wen made many political decisions to benefit her country and develop its economy in an attempt to reaffirm its personal strengths and its independence. She notably vowed to encouraging work in biotech and renewable resources.
